Message from the Principal!

The administrative teams of Paul V. Moore High School and the Central Square Middle School would like to share concerns we have been addressing recently. There have been a number of occasions where students have used racial slurs and other derogatory language. As a school community, hate speech has no place within our walls or on our campuses. We strive to provide an inclusive and equitable school environment for all students. The use of racial and homophobic slurs, as well as other offensive terms, promotes an intolerant atmosphere.

We are asking for your support and assistance in speaking with your children. Please remind them that this sort of language is prohibited by our Central Square School District [Code of Conduct](#) and will result in disciplinary action. There are a number of ways to report problems or concerns, including our [Stop Bullying](#) link, which can be found on our Central Square School District website. We take all concerns very seriously and our Dignity for All Students Act Building Coordinators will lead investigations into claims regarding bullying, harassment, and/or discrimination.

A number of resources are available for support and counseling. If you need additional information about such resources, please contact your child's school and you will be directed to the appropriate administrator or department. By working together, we can ensure a better school experience for all students.

We want to offer a few reminders going forward. It has come to our attention that many students are calling or texting their parents throughout the day due to feeling unwell or wanting to be picked up. It is important that these students go to the nurse to be seen and then call home. Students going to bathrooms and calling parents creates a number of safety concerns. We also do not open our doors to let students in until 7:30. We do not have the staff to supervise students before then. All students that are dropped off will need to enter through the door by the flagpole.

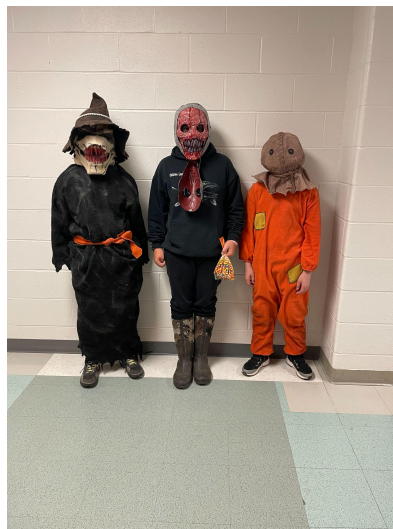

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Red Hawk Saver Banking



In its 7th year at the Middle School, the Redhawk saving program helps our students learn about the importance of saving, teaches them how to be money-wise and guides them to be smart money managers.

Here's how it works....

- Every other Thursday, as students arrive for school, an Empower Federal Credit Union representative accepts students' monetary deposits right in our cafeteria. Our Empower representative verifies all deposits and students receive special Redhawk Saver surprises to reward them for their positive saving habits. A receipt of their deposit is then generated and mailed directly to home.
