## Message from the CSMS Team!

Welcome to the beginning of another year at Central Square Middle School. As an administrative team we are excited to have both staff and students back in the building, and are looking forward to a new year!

Every year middle school requires flexibility and the ability to adjust to changing needs and conditions - this year will certainly not be the exception. Students, staff and parents will really need to work together and communicate moving forward to adjust to the continuously changing situation of both the world around us, and the normal growth and learning that occurs in middle school.

As a building we will be following the district protocols and procedures for Covid safety, working to meet the Social Emotional needs of our students, and help our students overcome the disruptions to the learning process from the past 2 years.

As part of our 2021-2022 school improvement plan we plan to focus on engaging students in school with a focus on fostering relationships between students and staff. There will be many opportunities to create or continue activities to engage all students in areas of interest afterschool. We will also be revamping our CSMS mentor program to reach more students and provide additional support after a tumultuous 18 months. We encourage everyone to join in on the forthcoming opportunities as a way to strengthen student engagement and build an even stronger CSMS school community.

Moving forward we will be focusing on student needs in the 7th and 8th grade based on data during their scheduled "What I Need" (WIN) formerly Academic Recovery (AR). As a school wide program these periods will now be focused on building additional needed skills with a focus on real world application in the Social Studies and Science (civic responsibility, current events, research-based investigations) through project based learning activities. Students who do not have AIS, Band, or Chorus are enrolled in WIN, where they will receive either remediation and practice or enrichment to improve upon other academic areas.

We thank you again for your continued support through these ever-changing times. We look forward to a wonderful year here at Central Square Middle School!

#### **REMINDERS!**

• Breakfast will be served daily and students that would like to eat breakfast will be let in the building at 7:20. All other students will be allowed in the building at 7:30. Pick up for students will start promptly at 2:20. Reminder if you are picking up your student you will need to sign them out. For the first day of school September 7th we will begin dismissal slightly earlier. Please be here to pick up your student no later than 2:00 on September 7th!



- The decision has been made to start the 2021-22 school year not having students change for Physical Education. At this time, we want to minimize locker room use and potential exposure of students.
- No bus passes will be allowed this year unless the student has to get off the bus at a different location that is on his normal bus run. All bus seats are reserved ahead of time and there are seating charts for contract tracing purposes.
- All students should have their hats and hoods off when they enter the building. This is a safety protocol to identify who is in the hallway.
- All electronic devices should be off and away during the day unless specifically being used for academics. If you need to get a message to your child please contact the main office.

## **Nurse Updates**

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6th Grade Parents: Proof of the Tdap immunization is due to the nurse UNLESS your child has a FALL BIRTHDAY and is currently I 10 years old. After 9/22, students will need to be excluded from school until proof of immunizations are submitted to the school per NYS Law. Fall birthday students will have 14 days from their birthday to submit proof before they are excluded.

**7th Grade Parents:** Proof of the meningitis vaccine must be submitted to the nurse. After 9/22, your child will need to be excluded from school if the nurse does not have proof on file. Any questions or concerns, please contact the Nurse's office.


## **Construction Update**
