Thank you to all of our players, coaches, staff and the Flock that made this year's Homecoming a fun, successful event for everyone involved!



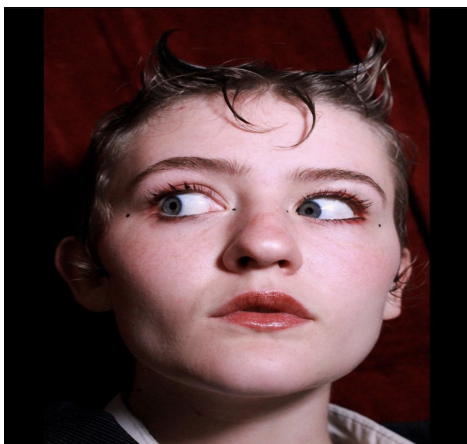

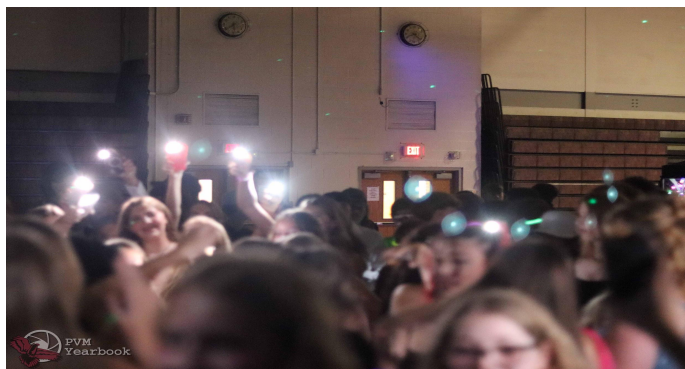

As a student, I am excited to see what the future holds for students and staff at Paul V. Moore High School. This winter may be cold, but will be just as much fun as the fall was!

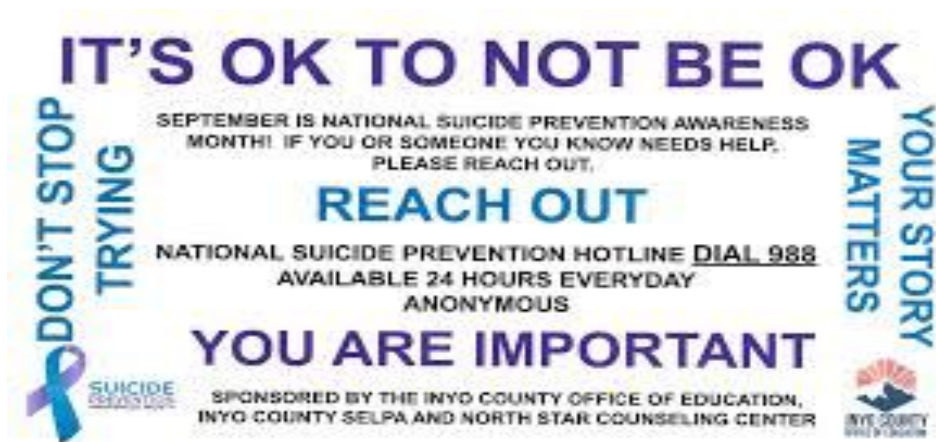

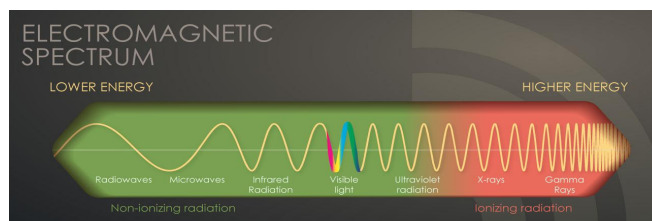


Rumored Radioactivity From Phones

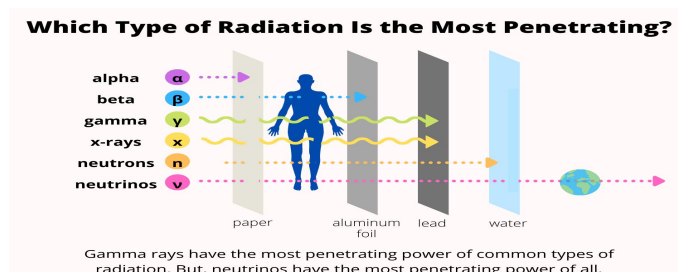

As some of you may know (especially those with nervous parents), phones have been rumored to emit cancer-causing radioactive particles. While it is true that phones do produce radioactive particles while in use, it is not true that they are cancer causing. The type of radiation that a mobile phone produces is classified as ‘non-ionizing’. To put it for the people who haven’t taken a chemistry class, non-ionizing radiation is the same type of radiation emitted from applications like a radio, or an old television.

This spectrum accurately represents the types of radiation. As you can see, Radio waves (the type of radiation emitted from a phone), is all the way back in the lowest energy. Try and think of radiation as balls trying to fit through a tennis net; things like radio waves would be similar to a basketball trying to fit through the holes on a tennis net, while something like a Gamma Ray would be similar to a bouncy ball trying to fit.



For a more accurate representation, replace the tennis net with your body, and the balls with radiation particles. Phones produce particles too big to even fit inside of your skin; they are so large that they cannot even penetrate a sheet of paper.

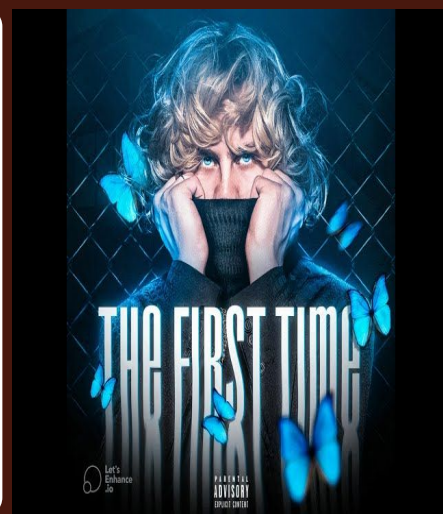

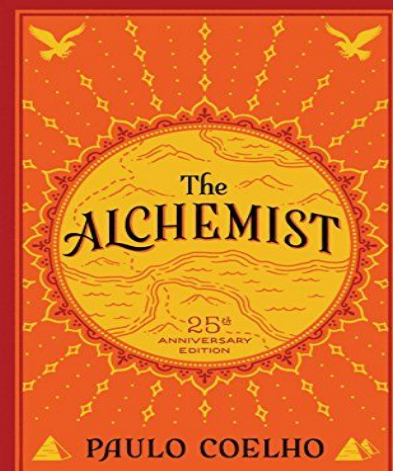


LITERATURE
