


### Star Light, Star Bright!


### A Season of Change



### **Self Esteem and Dating**

The month of February is a great time to reflect on self-esteem, and dating can play a significant role on one's level of self-confidence and dignity. February is also Teen Dating Violence Awareness Month, so it's important to pay attention to self-care and to recognize the signs of an unhealthy relationship.

There are many ways to boost self-esteem. One important step to increasing self esteem is to end the negative self-talk. Oftentimes, the labels we assign ourselves shape our perceptions and self concept, and most of the time they are negative and simply untrue. It's important to become aware, and when the negative thoughts start to creep in, it is important to challenge them and replace them with more accurate ideas that focus on your strengths, not your flaws! When people learn to accept their flaws, they can simply move on to embrace and discover their strengths and positive attributes. It is also important to maintain positive relationships and avoid people who may not be supportive. In some cases, these relationships can turn abusive, so it is important to recognize the signs.

Dating violence can be physical or verbal abuse, it may involve sexual violence, or psychological distress. One in four teens experience dating violence. Nearly 1.5 million high school students fall victim to abuse from a partner. Most people don't tell anyone if they are being abused, only 33% do, so it is important to recognize the signs, which include: using insults, intimidation, or humiliation, extreme jealousy, insecurity, or controlling behavior, isolation from friends and family, unwanted sexual contact of any kind, explosive temper or unusual moodiness, constantly monitoring social media activities or location, invasions of privacy; showing up unannounced, leaving unwanted items, gifts, or flowers, abusing alcohol or drugs, or threatening or causing physical violence. If you are experiencing any of these behaviors or if you know anyone who is, please tell someone. Love is respect.

#### Movies Of The Month: Dune 2



## **Song Of The Month:** New Album- 1989 (Taylor's Version) by Abigail Tetrault



Narcissistic personality disorder is a mental health condition in which people have an unreasonably high sense of their own importance. They constantly seek too much attention and want others to revere them. People with this disorder lack the ability to acknowledge or consider the feelings of others.

Have you ever wondered if you're dating a narcissist, or possibly wondered if someone else you know may be in a relationship with a narcissistic person? Between 0.5%-5% of people have narcissistic personality disorder. Typically around 7.7% of males and 4.8% of females in the general population have this mental health disorder. They make you believe you're extremely loved and cared for, but then make you feel awful for the tiniest thing. They try to make you feel unworthy because they always make you the bad guy.
